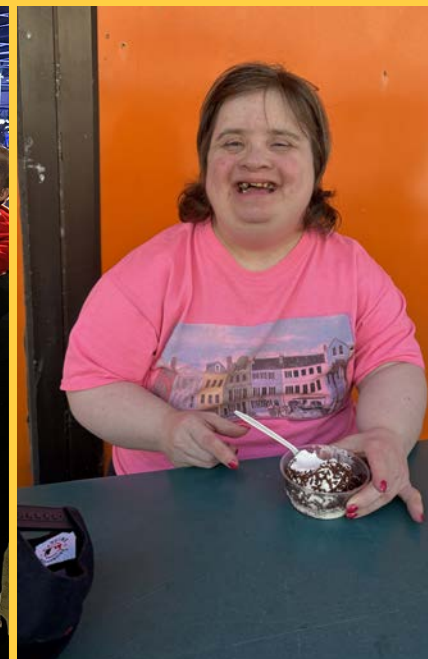

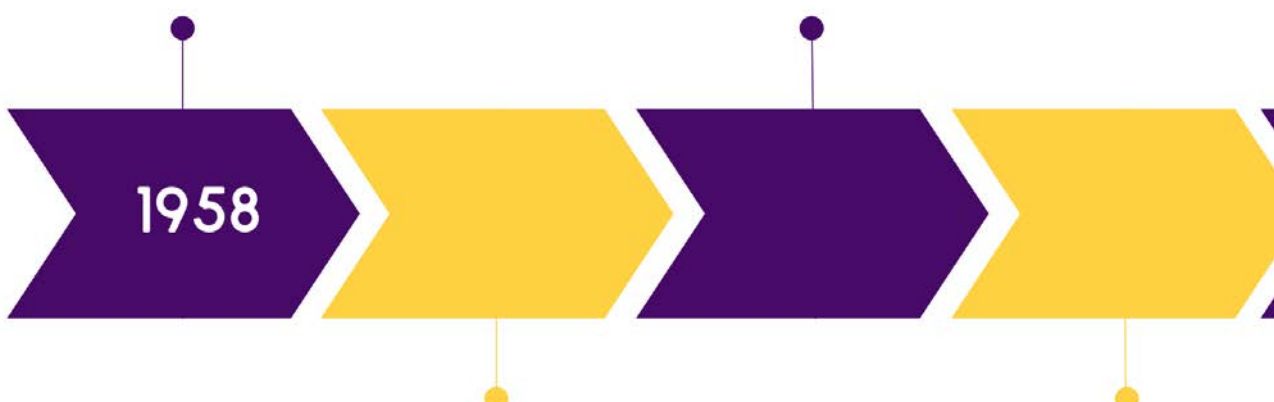
Bridgewell's history began in **1958**, when a group of parents and community advocates established the Child Guidance Center in Lynn, a program of the Greater Lynn Mental Health Association (GLMHA), to support children experiencing emotional and behavioral challenges. From the beginning, the organization was founded on the belief that every individual deserves the opportunity to thrive in their community.

As community needs evolved, the organization expanded its services. In the early **1970s**, GLMHA began supporting adults with psychiatric disabilities and opened its first community-based residential program for adults with developmental disabilities during the era of deinstitutionalization. Reflecting its broader mission, the organization became the Greater Lynn Mental Health and Retardation Association (GLMHRA).

Throughout the **1980s** and **1990s**, GLMHRA broadened its continuum of care by launching START Clinical Services (now The Sovner Center), expanding day habilitation, employment, and residential programs, and developing affordable and supportive housing. In **1993**, the organization received its first U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funding to provide housing for individuals experiencing homelessness and housing instability in Lynn and Lowell.

As GLMHRA's services, geographic reach, and impact continued to grow, the organization adopted the name Bridgewell in **2005**. The new name

reflected both the diversity of the people served and the organization's commitment to bridging barriers and building pathways to opportunity and wellness throughout northeastern Massachusetts.

HISTORY

Bridgewell continued to expand in the **2010s**, opening Rosewood Day Habilitation programs for young adults with autism, launching the Autism Family Support Center in **2016**, and strengthening its continuum of care through its **2014** merger with Project COPE, which expanded substance use prevention, treatment, and recovery services.

In **2017**, Bridgewell relocated its headquarters to Peabody, consolidating administrative, training, human resources, and program management functions into a centralized location designed to support continued growth, innovation, and operational excellence. The move reflected the organization's expanding regional presence and strengthened its ability to serve communities across northeastern Massachusetts.

During the COVID-19 pandemic in **2020**, Bridgewell remained steadfast in its commitment to those it serves. Residential programs continued operating 24 hours a day, seven days a week, while outpatient, family support, recreation, and behavioral health services quickly adapted to virtual platforms. Staff met people where they were, ensuring continuity of care, connection, and support during an unprecedented period of uncertainty.

Today, Bridgewell is one of the largest human services organizations in Massachusetts, providing a comprehensive continuum of support for people with developmental and intellectual disabilities, autism, mental health challenges, substance use disorders, and housing instability. With more than 100 programs across the region, Bridgewell continues to build on its legacy of innovation, inclusion, and community-based care, expanding services and responding to emerging needs so that every person has the opportunity to achieve their fullest potential.

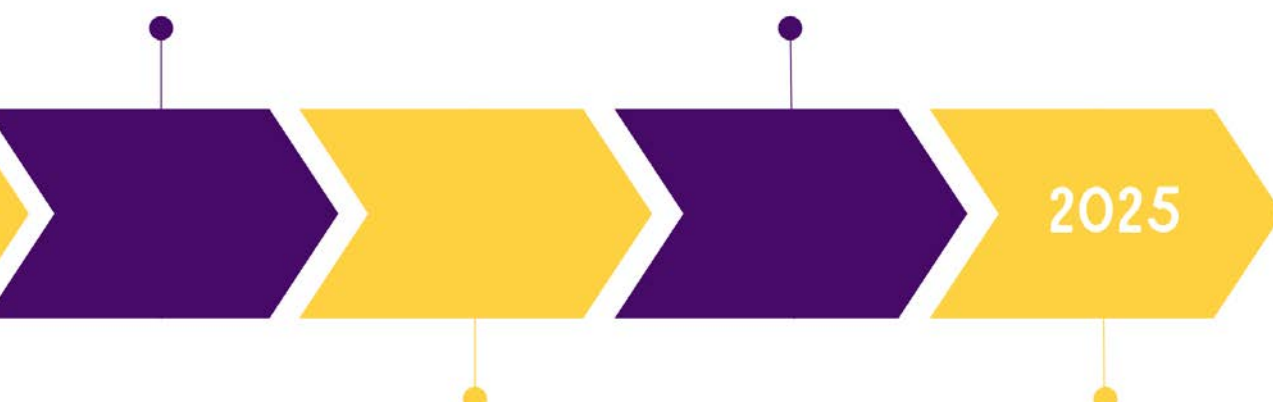

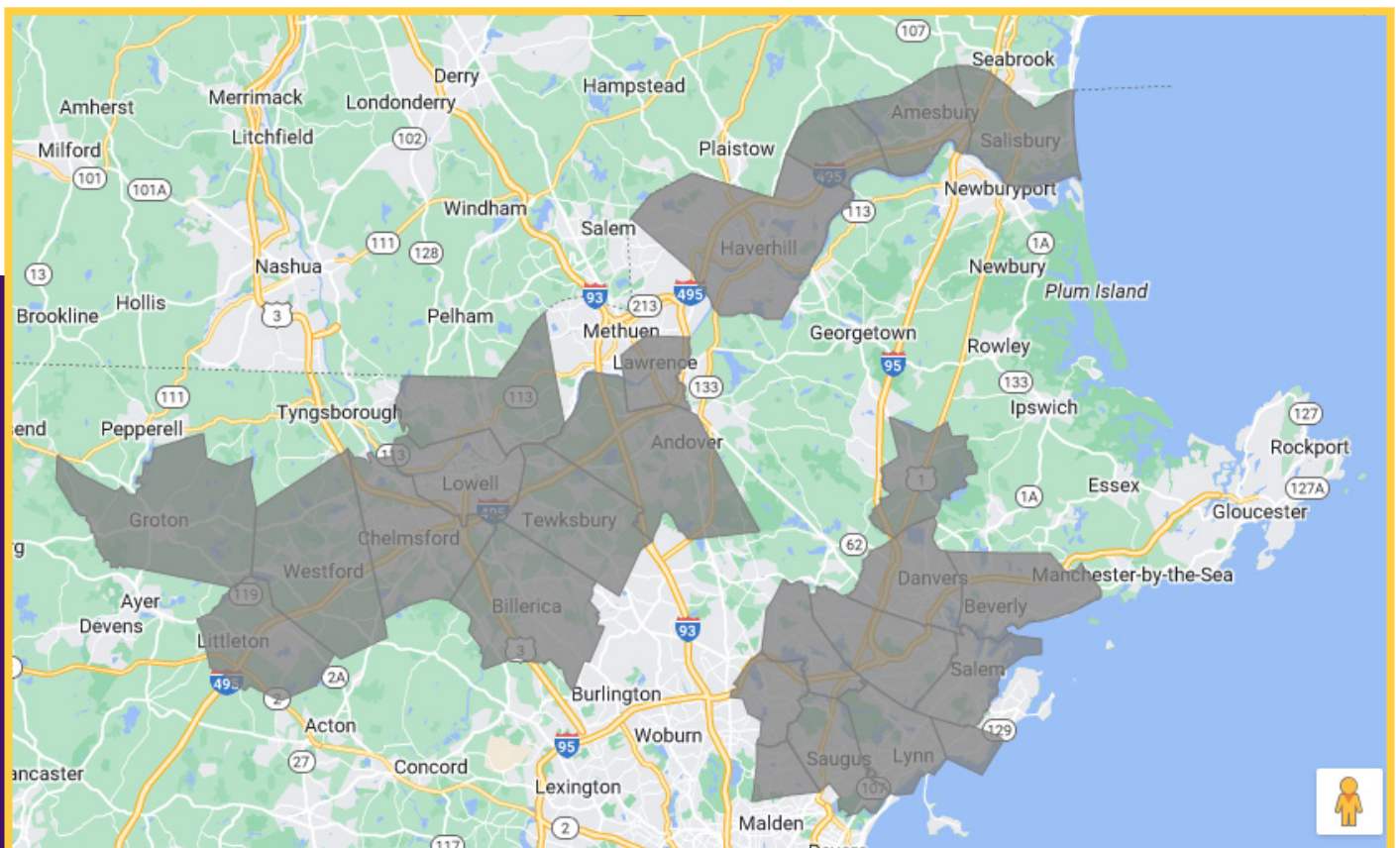
PROGRAMS & SERVICES

PROGRAMS & SERVICES

Autism Services

As a leading provider of autism services, Bridgewell specializes in helping young adults who are transitioning from the educational system to adult services through day habilitation programs, community housing, outpatient behavioral health treatment, educational opportunities, employment training, and transportation. Our Family Support Center provides services to people and their families from diverse cultural, ethnic and linguistic backgrounds, including those supporting an individual with autism.

Disability Services

Community housing, day habilitation programs, and employment supports: Bridgewell supports people with developmental, intellectual, and physical disabilities through community housing – including 65 group residences – day habilitation programs, employment support services, transportation, and other offerings aimed at empowering them to live safe, self-directed and productive lives as active members of their communities.



PROGRAMS & SERVICES

Homelessness and Housing Services

Bridgewell's housing programs include counseling focused on supporting people who are homeless, and person-centered supportive services that help them develop a path to stable housing and self-sufficiency. Bridgewell is also a housing authority, with more than 200 affordable housing units in northeastern Massachusetts.

Recovery Services

Each person with a substance use disorder requires a different mix of services, including counseling, community and recovery housing, and job placement. Bridgewell coordinates with area healthcare centers, the criminal justice system, and community agencies to identify people in need and support them on the path to recovery with an evidence-based, person-centered approach to services.

In February 2026, Bridgewell expanded its service area and opened another fully accessible medical residential program. The one-story residence is designed to serve individuals with significant developmental and physical disabilities. With room for four residents, this is Bridgewell's first group home in Groveland, representing our commitment to expanding care across the region for individuals with intellectual, developmental and physical disabilities.



PROGRAMS & SERVICES

Family Support Center

Bridgewell's Family Support Center provides services to people and their families from diverse cultural, ethnic and linguistic backgrounds, including those who are supporting an individual with autism. The purpose of the Family Support Center is to support families when they need it most, providing resources, educational opportunities, and enrichment activities for people with autism and developmental disabilities, and their family members or guardians helping them to attain services, to positively impact their lives.

PROGRAMS & SERVICES

Natasha David-Hays joined the Bridgewell team as Clinic Director for Bridgewell Counseling Services, Amesbury in December 2025. She oversees the clinical and administrative functions of the clinic, ensuring the provision of quality treatment for children and adults, including developmental, psychiatric, and recovery services. She also provides leadership oversight to clinical staff while supporting their growth and development.



"With over a decade of clinical practice in the North Shore, Natasha has a deep grasp of the behavioral health needs of children and adults in our community," said Christopher Tuttle, Bridgewell President and CEO. "Her passion and broad experience serving nonprofit health systems and promoting recovery will enable us to continue evolving our outpatient practice to meet the intensifying demand for mental health care."

Behavioral Health Services

Bridgewell provides comprehensive treatment for children and adults challenged with psychiatric, and sometimes developmental disabilities. Services include outpatient treatment through Bridgewell Counseling Services clinics in Amesbury and Lowell, and The Sovner Center in Danvers. *Clinical Specialties:*

Bridgewell Counseling Services, Amesbury provides outpatient behavioral health services for adults, including medication management and psychotherapy for individuals, groups or couples including medication management, counseling, education and evaluation.

Bridgewell Counseling Services, Lowell provides outpatient behavioral health services for adults and children, including medication management and psychotherapy for individuals, groups or couples, with a special focus on persistent mental illness, and families transitioning through divorce or adoption.

The Sovner Center, Danvers is an outpatient behavioral health clinic specializing in medication management, counseling, education, evaluation and other supports for adults with a dual diagnosis of developmental and psychiatric disability, including those with an autism spectrum disorder. Our experienced team of clinical nurse specialists, psychiatrists, and psychotherapists provide services in a manner that ensures that individuals and their families, other care providers and advocates are active collaborators in the process of growth and change. In addition to the services offered in Danvers, therapy is also offered at several outreach sites in neighboring cities and towns.

HIGH STANDARDS OF CARE

In May 2026, Bridgewell received a three-year accreditation from the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF), for meeting internationally recognized benchmarks for standards of care and quality of services.

The CARF site survey, which took place at Bridgewell in April, is a rigorous, three-day process during which a team of surveyors visits programs, observes business operations and service delivery, and reviews policies, financial statements, record-keeping, and extensive program documentation. The surveyors also conduct confidential interviews with employees, board members, individuals served, and family members.



"Bridgewell is proud to have earned the prestigious CARF accreditation, as it recognizes our commitment to providing quality, compassionate care, and support," Bridgewell President and CEO Christopher Tuttle said. "The CARF accreditation is reflective of the dedication that each and every employee in our organization has to empowering individuals in need and helping them to live safe and fulfilling lives."

The areas of strength noted in the CARF report include:

- An acknowledgement of strong leadership and governance that provides clear vision, responsible oversight, and strategic direction;
- Dedication to providing a continuum of care for individuals served;
- Praise for the high level of advocacy, education, and training available to individuals served, resulting in their appreciation of the independence and agency that Bridgewell provides; and
- A commitment to staff training, professional development, and specialized staff training tailored to individuals' needs.
- In addition, Bridgewell is one of a very limited number of providers to receive accreditation for its standards of support for individuals with dementia and Alzheimer's disease.

CARF accreditation has been the recognized benchmark of quality health and human services for more than 50 years. The accreditation is an ongoing process that distinguishes a provider's service delivery and signals to the public that the provider is committed to continuous performance improvement, responsive to feedback, and accountable to the community and its other stakeholders.

LAPIERRE LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

Bridgewell's LaPierre Leadership Academy is a comprehensive leadership development program for Bridgewell staff consisting of four full-day trainings – Role of the Leader, Effective Communication, People Development, and Team Building – followed by a practice and presentation day.

In 2026, the training series content was reimagined, updated and relaunched by a cross-functional team of Bridgewell leaders and training team members, who also serve as the program's facilitators. The Academy was renamed in honor of Gary LaPierre, former Assistant Training Director, who helped shape and strengthen the Supervisory Skills Training over many years. LaPierre retired from Bridgewell in 2025 after 43 years of service.

Designed to strengthen leadership and business management skills, the Academy equips managers with the tools to build strong teams, foster positive work environments, foster staff development and broader organizational knowledge, and support both Bridgewell employees and the people we serve. A similar training series, called Supervisory Skills Training, had been offered to managers across the organization for nearly 30 years, and it was a cornerstone of leadership development at Bridgewell.

Key topics of the LaPierre Leadership Academy training series include planning and prioritization, performance management, effective use of resources, financial and budgeting processes, strategic thinking, and organizational leadership. Participants also develop skills in building relationships with colleagues, stakeholders, and regulatory partners, while reinforcing



Bridgewell's core values of dignity, respect, caring, integrity, safety, and wellness.

Upon graduation, participants are prepared to adapt their leadership styles to meet the needs of their teams, foster open communication and mutual respect, and create workplace cultures that drive positive outcomes across the Bridgewell community.

CELEBRATION OF COMMUNITY

Bridgewell's *Celebration of Community* is a series of activities and events held each October that connect participants from our programs, their family members, and our employees and volunteers, with our partners and supporters in the communities we serve.

For the fifth year in a row, Bridgewell kicked off our *Celebration of Community* with a Day of Service at Newhall Fields Community Farm in Peabody. Close to 70 people, including people from Bridgewell's autism day programs, disability services, housing and recovery programs, and staff, as well as partners from local community companies JEOL and Stefano's Landscaping, assisted with fall harvest work at the farm. Senator Joan Lovely also joined our team as well!

Celebration of Community also allows Bridgewell to increase awareness of the impactful work our team does each day for the more than 7,200 people in our services across northeastern Massachusetts, and it includes opportunities to donate in support of Bridgewell's vital mission.

This year included a Day of Service, Bridgewell Formal, Trunk or Treat Halloween events, participation in the Flutie Foundation 5K for Autism and more. In the past it has included a blood drive, food and canned goods collection, and other fun initiatives to convene and celebrate our shared community.



BOWLING FOR BRIDGEWELL

Wrapping up Bridgewell's month-long *Celebration of Community*, Bowling for Bridgewell: Pins for Possibilities was a success! Close to 100 people joined us at our first bowling event at Gametime Lanes & Entertainment in Peabody. Guests enjoyed bowling, mingling and appetizers, and those not interested in bowling enjoy axe-throwing and pool.

Through sponsorship, event tickets and raffle donations, Bowling for Bridgewell: Pins for Possibilities raised more than \$18,000 in support of Bridgewell's programs and services. Amy Sutton took home the Highest Score trophy, and Lynn Lewis won New England Patriots tickets through the Gameday or Payday Raffle. The prize was generously donated by Lancelot Janitorial.

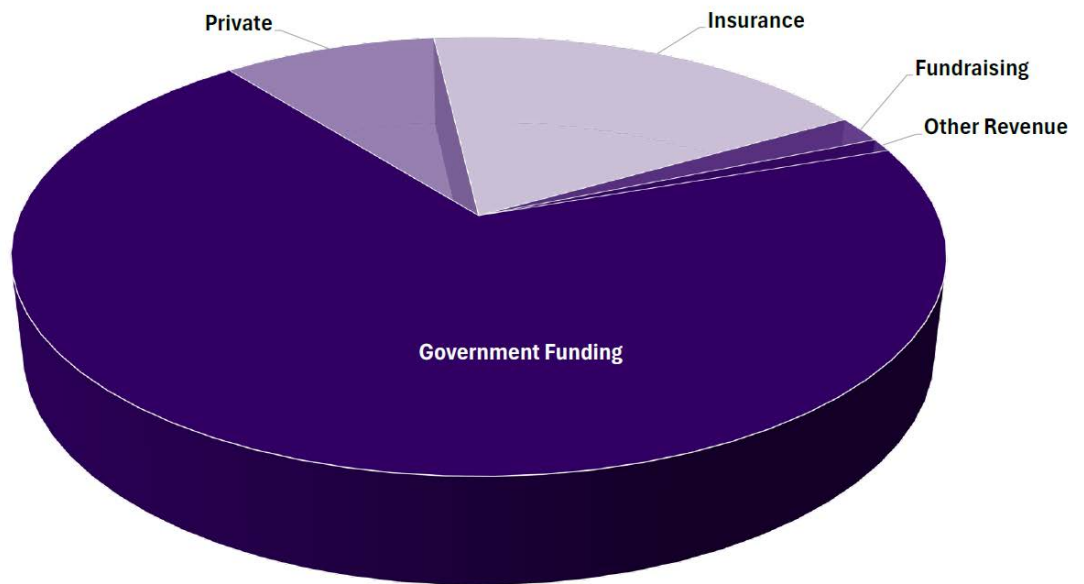

FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

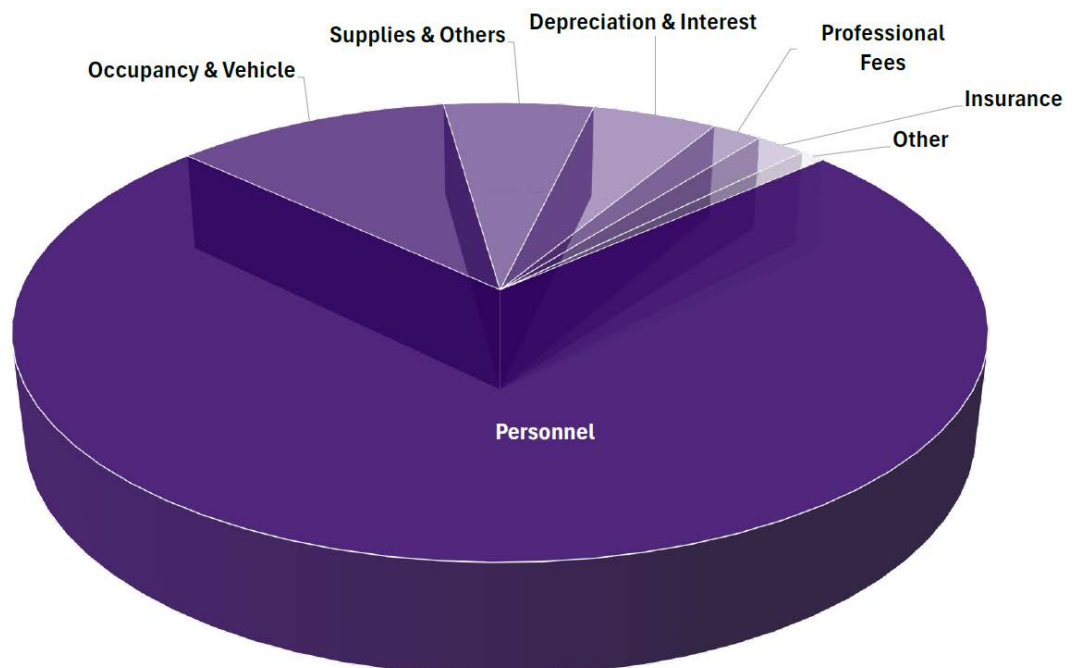
REVENUE
